We are expecting a hot and sunny Saturday, so break out your flip flops and shorts and come shop for both fall and summer favorites.

How about apple cider? Salatin's Orchards and Rice Family Harvest expect to bring some of their early apple cider. Ask about how they blend the apples to hit just the right taste and it will sound like you're talking with a winemaker, not a farmer.

This week, you will find a nice variety of apples, including Honeycrisp, Jonathans, MacIntosh, Galas and whatever else turned ripe in the warm temperatures.



You will also find a nice selection of early winter squash for

roasting, and pumpkins for pies or Jack-o-lanterns.

A lot of our summer favorites are making a late push, like tomatoes, peppers, melons, beans, chiles, zucchini, cucumbers and a new batch of summer salad greens. Some of the growers continue to offer deals on bulk tomatoes for cooking, this week including Bethel Lane Farms.

This is a great time at the Market. We hope to see you there.
